RESOLVING CONFLICT

A DVD Resource for Citizenship Education and Mediation

The cases presented in this resource enable students to see at first hand situations where conflict has occurred and to examine the causes and consequences of violent behaviour.

The Activities and Briefings in the 57 page Workbook have been designed to enable them to test out and evaluate the different ways of responding to conflict.

1 Road rage A taxi driver and a cyclist describe a violent confrontation and how the aftermath has blighted their lives. What are the root causes of violence? How can you avoid or reduce aggressive behaviour?

2 Bullying at school Young people describe being bullied and how it has plagued them. Pupils show how to tackle bullying and aggression through peer counselling, forum theatre etc.

3 Mediating disputes Pupil mediators and pupils who have been through mediation explain how antagonism and violence in school can be reduced. Why does mediation work?

4 Criminal conflict – victim/offender Making the offender face up to the harm they have done is a compelling way of dealing with crime. A mother and the youth responsible for her son's death describe the effect of a restorative meeting.

5 Domestic violence Nearly a quarter of women in relationships experience violence at the hands of their male partners. Women and children are forced to take refuge. A young man with a history of violence addresses his behaviour and says what motivated him and what he is doing to remedy it.

6 Up against the law Racial conflict between the black community and the police has become the focus of attention since the Stephen Lawrence Inquiry; individual victims and the police speak out on institutional racism and the impact of an apology.

7 Conflict and change Conflict of interest brings people into confrontation. Powerful images show individuals and groups taking direct action on GM food, the environment and nuclear weapons. Using nonviolence, activists claim that conflict can be used responsibly and is empowering.

8 Making peace – Northern Ireland

The community has been shattered by war. Young people are demanding change. In their daily lives and in their relationships, they are shaping a future without violence, while respecting differences.

9 After apartheid – South Africa The Truth and Reconciliation Commission was set up to bring a deeply divided people together. A police officer convicted of crimes under apartheid is given the chance to meet the relatives of his victims in return for amnesty and freedom. What happens?
