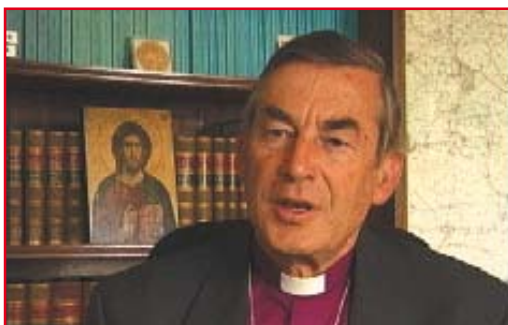

Why Morality?

UNIT 1: Do You Need Religion to Know the Difference Between Right and Wrong?

A rabbi, a bishop, an Islamic elder, an atheist, a humanist and *The Sun* editor argue over whether morality comes from religion and a belief in God or from our own human values. Linked activities on: Can morals change over time? Why is it men who mostly tell us what to do?

UNIT 2: Is Sex Wrong Before Marriage?

Religious leaders universally disapprove of sex outside of marriage, they confront the 'sex with responsibility argument' from non-believers. *The Sun* editor on morality and *Page Three*. Linked activities: Is "thou shalt **not...**" the only commandment?

UNIT 3: Abortion – A Moral or a Social Issue?

The key issues, right to life, choice and responsibility are passionately argued. Linked activities: Can situation and circumstance change moral absolutes: abortion, war, battered wives. Public morals *versus* personal rights.

UNIT 4: Is There a Judgement Day?

Heaven and hell feature in all the major religions as a key moral sanction. But the afterlife has all but disappeared from the popular imagination. 'It's only a story – wishful thinking' asserts atheist Rosen. The religious leaders argue back. Linked activities – can guilt and damnation police the good life?
